The West of England councils are working together to produce a new transport plan for the area. Transport is an important issue, affecting everyone, and we want your views on it.

Our current plan

We produced our first transport plan together in 2006. This was the first phase of our vision. As a result we are currently delivering the £70 million Greater Bristol Bus Network; three major transport schemes have first phase approval for Government funding totalling £49 million for a package of improvements in Bath, £43 million for the Ashton Vale Rapid Transit route and £11 million for a package of improvements in Weston-super-Mare. In Spring 2010 we submitted two more bids to Government for £47 million for the South Bristol Link, and £168 million for the North Fringe to Hengrove package.

Our Key Goals

Our Plan is based around five key transport goals which take account of transport's wider impact on climate change, economic growth, equality, health, quality of life and the natural environment.

Our plan's five key goals	Which would you focus on in the first three years? please tick one	Which is most important for our future? please tick one
Reduce carbon emissions Promoting low carbon travel choices, reducing traffic and adapting to the effects of climate change by increasing the transport network's ability to cope with extreme weather events.		
Support economic growth Tackling congestion, improving reliability and journey times and improving links to existing, and new, homes and jobs.		
Promote equality of opportunity Improving accessibility for all residents to local services, assisting neighbourhood renewal and regeneration, and addressing the needs of people with mobility problems.		
Contribute to better health, safety and security Improving road safety, air quality and personal security on the transport network. Also, promoting more physically active travel e.g. walking and cycling.		
Improve quality of life and a healthy natural environment Reducing the impact of transport on the environment, reducing noise pollution and enhancing our streetscape and public spaces. Also, promoting better access to leisure activities and the countryside.

Question 2: Where do you think it is most important to focus investment?

Transport costs

The four councils currently have a combined budget of £13 million to spend on smaller scale transport projects and £14 million for maintenance each year. It's important to think carefully about where we invest, and what we invest in, especially over the next three years, as council spending comes under increased pressure.

Examples of transport costs:

Pedestrian bridge over a road – about £2 million.

New railway station – about £5 million.

Traffic lights with pedestrian controls – about £150,000.

The West of England Councils also spend over £20 million supporting bus, rail, Park & Ride travel and concessionary fares.

Moving forwards

We have a 3-year action plan that sets out how we will progress work towards the five goals and we'd like your views on these. Bearing in mind the increased pressure on council spending, **please select three areas where you think it is most important to focus investment over the next three years, and one area which you think is the least important.**

Cycling Promoting cycling as a means of travel through education, training, publicity and improvements to cycling facilities and routes.		
Network management Management and maintenance of the local network of roads and footways to provide for all users e.g. engineering schemes, traffic control centres, traffic signal schemes - including possible removal, 20 mph zones, new roads, maintenance programmes and event, street works and incident management.		
Freight Measures such as recommended lorry routes, freight consolidation centres with smaller local deliveries, access controls and safe and fuel efficient driver training.		
Parking Measures such as providing and managing on and off street parking, enforcement of regulations, residents' parking schemes, disabled parking provision, Park & Rides and parking for coaches, lorries, motorcycles and cycles, innovative parking controls.		
Public transport Measures to enhance reliability, frequency of and access to travel by bus, coach, rail, Park & Ride, community transport, taxi and water transport and development of rapid transit.		
Road safety Measures such as speed management, engineering schemes, education, training and child safety schemes.		
Rural transport Measures to increase rural residents' access to services and transport options, reducing the impact of traffic on rural villages, supporting tourism and leisure activities, increasing the role of community transport.		
Smarter choices Measures to encourage sustainable travel e.g. better travel information, car sharing, travel planning and promotion of sustainable travel modes such as walking, cycling, public transport.		
Walking Promoting walking as a means of travel through better facilities, information and routes, Rights of Way Improvement Plan.
